







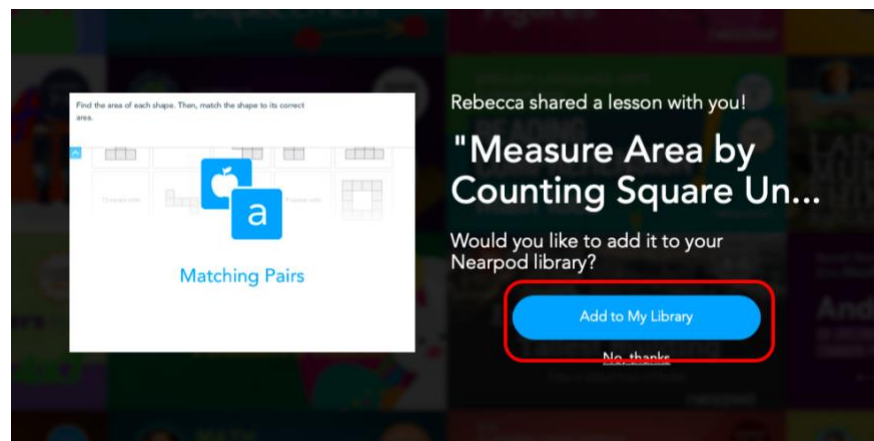
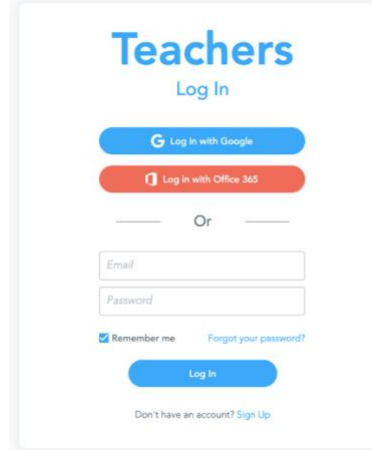
Creating a Nearpod Assignment in Canvas

1. In the GCG, click on the Nearpod lesson link you want to assign to students.

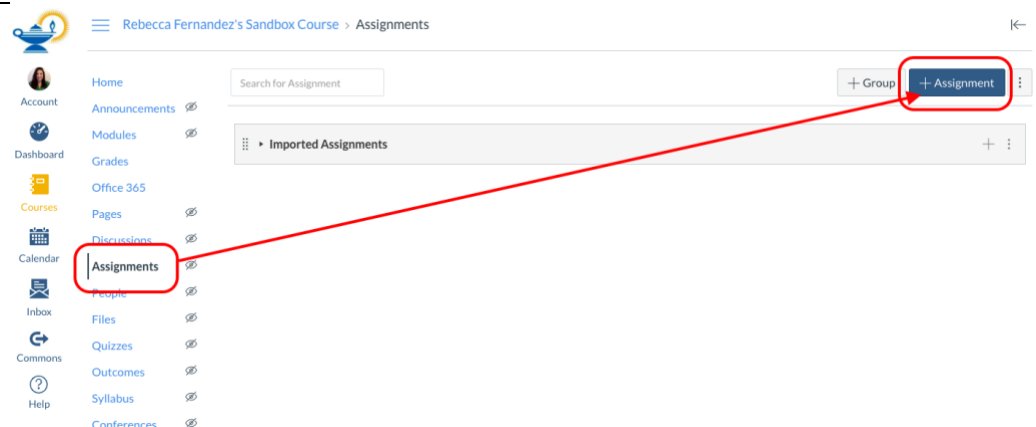

2. If you are not logged into Nearpod: Click **Log in with Office 365** and you should see the lesson appear. Click **Add to My Library**.

If you are already logged into Nearpod: The lesson will appear in a new web browser. Click **Add to My Library**.



3. Log in to Canvas. Click on **assignments**, then **+ Assignment**.



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4. Title the assignment.
Scroll down to find **Submission Type**.

Change submission type to **External Tool** and click **Find**.

5. Scroll to find and click on **Nearpod**.

Find the lesson you want to assign (that was just added to your library).

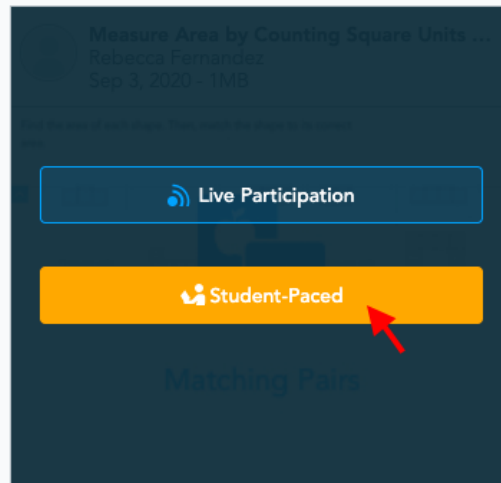
*You may first be prompted to log in to Nearpod through Canvas.

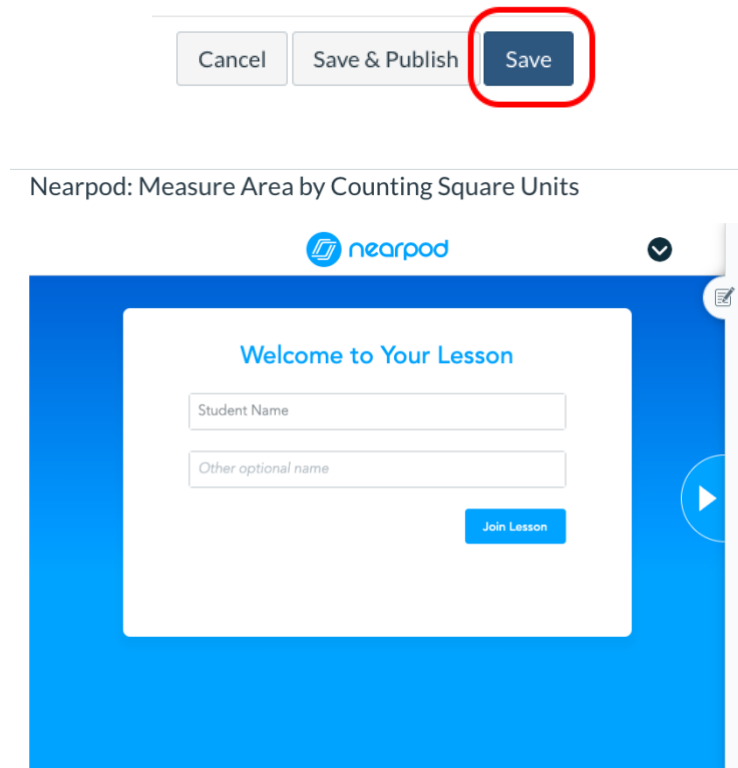
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6. Hover your mouse over the lesson and click **Student-Paced**.
